AIM

The primary goal of the Staff Week is to foster knowledge-sharing and the exchange of best practices through engaging discussions and interactive sessions.

This year's topics focus on mental health and stress in the workplace, as well as fears and stress related to student mobility.

Additionally, the event provides a unique opportunity to strengthen existing collaborations and establish new partnerships.

COST

Participants are expected to cover their own travel, accommodation, and excursion expenses through Erasmus+ or other funds.

The University of Zadar will cover the costs of coffee breaks, two lunches, a guided city tour, information kits, and certificates of attendance.

TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

- Participation is limited to two people per institution.
- The language of training is English.
- There is no registration fee.
- The number of participants is limited to a maximum of 50.

APPLICATION

Application procedure consists of **Mobility Agreement** and **on-line application form**. The application deadline is **February 10, 2025**.

Participants will be selected on the basis of the relevance of their field of interest and main responsibilities to the main topics as well as the quality of their Mobility Agreements. The DRAFT versions of the Mobility Agreement can be downloaded <u>here</u>.

HOW TO GET TO Z A D A R

BY PLANE

Zadar Airport: Located in Zemunik, approximately 12 km from Zadar, it offers flights to various European cities. For the latest flight schedules and destinations, visit the official website: <u>www.zadar-airport.hr</u>.

Airport to City Transport:

- Bus: A one-way ticket to the main bus station or city center costs €5.
- Taxi: The fare to Zadar city center is approximately €25.

BY BUS



BY FERRY

The ferry port Gaženica connects Zadar with Ancona (Italy) and some ferry ports on Croatian islands and harbours. Information about schedules and destinations can be found on the official web sites of Jadrolinija.https://www.jadrolinija.hr/.

BY CAR

You can use one of two possible roads: A1 Highway from the direction of Zagreb/Rijeka – exit Zadar Zapad (Zadar West) or from the direction of Split – exit Zadar Istok (Zadar East) or DC8 Adriatic road.
