

Medical insurance

All foreign students must have medical insurance covered during their stay in Croatia. EU nationals must have European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Non EU nationals should check with the healthcare provider at home and/or their home university. **SEE MORE**

Research your destination thoroughly before you go.
Read syllabi, select courses with your home coordinator and create OLA /LA.



Get your Acceptance letter

Once your OLA / LA is approved we will send you the **Acceptance letter** and other practical information.

Most exchange students rent private accommodation because there are only 10 places intended for exchange students in the student dormitory.

Apply following the admission procedure

Make sure you are **nominated** by your home University. All nominated students will get the information about **admission procedure** on their email.



Apply for visa / get medical insurance

Before arrival to Zadar you should apply for visa and get an EHIC or private medical insurance.

Welcome days

Residence permit


